League FAQs

Q. How are the players being evaluated?

A. *Players will be evaluated by experienced coaches on hitting (in the cage vs machine), Speed/Agility, Fielding grounders, Fielding Fly balls, Throwing ability, and optional pitching. Players are scored on a five point system in various component skills (5=Majors All star, 4=Majors, 3=AAA, 2=AA, 1=A).*

Q. How will teams be formed?

A. *Majors teams will form first, with the two coaches alternating in the drafting of players.*

AAA will be assigned by the Player Agent from the remaining players, forming as many teams as are supported by the number of players we have.

AA, A and Teeball will be assigned based on age and/or scores from tryouts. School and geography will be taken into account when assigning teams.

The goal is balanced teams at all levels.

Q. I requested for my child to play with a certain coach or a friend, will that happen?

A. *Requests will be honored when possible. This is more likely at the younger levels such as A and AA. At the Majors level, the draft will determine teams, and special requests may be difficult to comply with and cannot be guaranteed.*

Q. How often will we practice or have games?

A. *This depends on the level and coach. An outline of expectations are available at <http://wcll.org/divisions.htm> or see the following (an event is either a practice OR a game)*

Teeball – approximately 2-3 events per week (2 weeknights and one Saturday)

A – 2-4 events per week (2-3 weeknights, 1 Saturday)

AA – 3-5 events per week (3-4 weeknights, 1 Saturday)

AAA and Majors – 4-6 events per week (Up to 5 practices a week in March, up to 3 games per week in season)

Q. When does the season start/end?

A. *Practices will start in March for most levels. Games start in early April. WCLL season ends no later than June 15th.*
